

In the exhibition, *ArchitorSpace\_Vacancy*, photographer Daniel Mirer explores the banality of post-industrial architecture. While many of the environments selected by Mirer evoke a sense of familiarity, it is the emptiness of these tunnels, façades, and lobbies that often resonate with the viewer.
